

Lack of Investigation of Civil Orders

Conflicts of Interest (COI) are buttressed by lack of investigation of civil orders. A COI can be as little as a secretary expecting a monetary staff award for a civil protection order, a Police Chief with a COI between police duties and civil complaints, or staff hiding their employment causes (associated with the victim's case) by freezing the victim's employment file and besmirching the victim that departs. Using a zero tolerance policy can buttress fraud or malfeasance.

Fraud in construction of the original complaint includes methods of assembly that involve fraud, lack of transparency, lack of disclosure and overall malfeasance using fraud in the construction methods. This should be completely evaluated from start to finish in each original complaint document. COI should be identified in determining if a frivolous order is being used to obstruct justice and hide COIs and possible fraud. .
